- Students are finding hourly work stocking shelves, working in nursing homes; they often do not feel their safety is a priority at their job.
- Students are questioning more than ever whether to stay in the U.S. or go back to their countries.





COVID-19 Legal Impacts for Undocumented Students

- Growing concerns: (un)employment & domestic violence
- Don't apply for Unemployment Insurance (UI) or CalFresh if you're not using your SSN.
- Fraud, ID Theft, extends processing time & impacts citizenship process
- Labor exploitation Seek out workers rights


