Dr. John Fraire, Interim Vice President of Student Services

Please welcome, John Fraire, Ph.D. who will serve as our Interim Vice President of Student Services, pending board approval on June 26. Dr. Fraire is an educator, theatre artist, and historian. Dr. Fraire has worked more than 40 years in higher education and has served as the senior enrollment and/or student affairs officer at several institutions such as Washington State University, Portland State University, Truman State University, Western Michigan University, and Brooklyn College/City University of New York. He was one of the first Mexican Americans to attend and graduate from Harvard University where he earned his BA and M.Ed. He also has an MA in History from Western Michigan University and a doctorate in history and humanities from Union Institute and University.

Dr. Fraire began his professional career in 1978 when he served on the Harvard admissions staff and helped establish their nationally recognized minority student recruitment programs. Throughout his career, he has been an advocate for access, equity, diversity, and first-generation students. Dr. Fraire is also an historian specializing in Midwest Chicano history and a playwright. His first play, co-authored with his brother Gabriel Fraire, Who Will Dance With Pancho Villa, was produced off Broadway by the Castillo Theater in New York City in 1994, and is planned for production by the Raven Playhouse Theatre Company in Healdsburg in their 24-25 season. The Raven Theatre produced another play by the Fraire brothers, Cesar Died Today, in January 2023. Dr. Fraire is the co-founder of Performance As Education/Las Memorias, a college readiness program for Latino and first-generation students that uses theatre and performance. He is currently a consultant with the Registry, an organization that provides individuals with senior leadership experience to interim positions throughout the country. He recently completed two years as the Interim Vice President for Student Affairs at CSU/Monterey Bay as a member of the Registry.



Ruth Jimenez, Interim Director of the Disability Resource and Personal Counseling Centers

We are pleased to introduce Ruth Jimenez as our Interim Director of the Disability Resource and Personal Counseling Centers. For the past two years, she has worked at Cañada College as an adjunct counselor for the Disability Resource Center (DRC) assisting students in providing accommodations and helping them reach their academic goals. Ruth is a first-generation Latina college student, a graduate of the University of Southern California with a master's degree in education in School Counseling. She has also received a graduate certificate from California State University Sacramento Adult Learning Disabilities certificate program. She steps into the role with 10 years of higher education work experience, having worked with a diverse population of students at various community colleges. Ruth believes there is no diversity, equity and inclusion without disability and she is dedicated to serving students in their accessibility needs.

Over the last 20 years, Colin has found joy and community via labors of love in San Francisco, San Rafael, Berkeley, East Oakland and

his hometown of Richmond, as a Basketball Coach, Poet/Emcee/DJ-Producer, documentary film narrator, Journalist, Educator-Organizer, After School Program Coordinator, Youth Development Case Manager, Educational Researcher and high school Lead Teacher, Instructional Coach and Dean of Culture. Some of the projects include Pirates of the Caribbean 3 (2007), Nike NBA commercial (2007), Pepsi Super Bowl Commercial (2006), and a NASCAR/ESPN tv spot (2008). Emilio was born in Chula Vista, CA. His parents are immigrants from Mexico and he is bilingual. He currently lives in the North Beach district of San Francisco with his wife, Michelle, who is also an artist. They are both very involved in the community, curating art shows, photographing events and DJ'ing on occasion. He loves music and is currently learning how to play the guitar.
