College Leadership Retreat

On August 8, more than 50 students, faculty, classified staff leaders and administrators joined together for Cañada College's 7th annual Leadership Retreat. Each year, the Retreat serves as a launching point for the College's implementation of its five-year <u>Educational Master Plan</u> (EMP). The retreat included four breakout sessions focused on choosing the top EMP priorities for 2024-25:


- Goal 1: Student Access, Success and Completion:

 - 2.10 Transform college participatory governance processes
 - 2.14 Evaluate academic support programs and practices
- Goal 3: Community Connections:
 - 3.2 Reach new community members in North Fair Oaks, Belle Haven, and East Palo Alto, especially BIPOC communities
 - o 3.8 Strengthen transfer support services to increase transfers
 - 3.11 Create and expand career exploration experiences for students
 - 3.12 Double the number of alumni connected to Cañada's Alumni Organization by 2027
- Goal 4: Accessible Infrastructure and Innovation:
 - 4.1 Improve access to campus via public transit, rideshare
 - 4.2 Build student housing and a childcare center
 - 4.3 Create a hub for evening and weekend students

Retreat participants focused on each of these priorities during four facilitated sessions and related small-group discussions. This allowed campus leaders to develop a shared understanding of the challenges and opportunities of each of these priorities as they organize their work on these important topics during the coming academic year. The middle schoolers were able to experience different career paths offered at Cañada, such as Medical Assisting, Radiologic Technology and Digital Arts & Animation. They also learned about Middle College and how to be financially savvy with SparkPoint. Finally, the students enjoyed fun activities such as Yoga, Ballet Folklorico and Basketball.
