#### **Mental Health and Wellness Support for Students**

This past year, faculty, staff and students have requested additional mental health and wellness resources and activities for students. In response to this growing need, the College has added two additional quiet/meditative spaces for student, staff and faculty members:

- Next month, the College will open a Meditation & Prayer Room details will be shared with the campus community soon!
- The Reparative Room (photo below) in the Cultural Center is located in Building 17, Room 109. The space is designed for healing activities and as a quiet area for students to meet, do school work and relax.

In addition to the new spaces, the College is exploring the possibility of an outdoor meditation/quiet area for students and the campus community.

Cañada College continues to offer free mental health services through our Personal Counseling Center (PCC), including 24/7 support via our Cañada Talk Now program. This service provides on-demand and scheduled mental health support from licensed therapists and supervised trainees. Additionally, our Disability Resource Center (DRC) provides students with disabilities, including mental health-related disabilities, accommodations, counseling and support in accordance with State and Federal laws. Students can contact both the PCC and DRC by phone, email or visit Building 5, Room 303. Also, in response to student and employee feedback, Cañada is planning to hire a second Personal Counselor this semester to join the College in Spring 2025. A second Personal Counselor will provide additional resources to support students.



### Office of Equity DEI Training

This August brought many opportunities for DEI training and facilitation. Faculty Equity Coordinator, Kiran Malavade and Director of Equity, Dr. Michiko Kealoha, facilitated a DEI onboarding for new faculty at their orientation. Dr. Kealoha also facilitated a five-hour DEI training for East Palo Alto's nonprofit Family Connections in an effort for our college to better assist nonprofits with a similar mission.



#### **EAPC** Retreat

This summer, the Equity and Anti-racism Planning Council (EAPC) held its annual retreat where they discussed connections to the community, challenging anti-Blackness and their prioritizations for Educational Master Plan goals. The following day the Council had an in-service with Parks and Recreation and helped to care for and mulch a local park that serves many of our families in Redwood City.

The Outreach team, Cultural Center team and Cañada retention team recently joined the PAL Center, Redwood City Mayor and the community to honor local youth for International Youth Day.
