Second Harvest of Silicon Valley Annual Valuation Letter for FY2023-24

Our SparkPoint team recently received the Food Valuation for our outdoor food distribution for Fiscal Year 2024 from Second Harvest Food Bank (SHFB). Based on SHFB's valuation letter, our SparkPoint team distributed 558,559 pounds of food and offset our student and community grocery expenditures by nearly \$1 million (\$968,740.20)! A huge thank you to the Cañadians who make the weekly food distribution happen, including our Facilities and Public Safety teams for their year-round support with this effort. A special thank you to SparkPoint Director, Adolfo Leiva, and SparkPoint Coordinators, Melissa Maldonado and Brianna Chavez, and the amazing Food Access Ambassadors (student assistants) and SHFB volunteers for their commitment and passion for serving our community. Thanks to this team effort, each week our numbers are increasing by 10-20 families and last week, we served a recordbreaking 377 families. It does take a village, and we could not do this without everyone's support!

On Wednesday, B.A.M. (Brothers Achieving Milestones) hosted their first semester event, welcoming students with pizza and snacks. - **Before November 1, 2024:** Deans and VPs provide feedback on submitted program reviews.
- Before November 8, 2024: Review your supervisor's feedback and incorporate it into a final submittal of your Comprehensive Program Review or Annual Plan in Nuventive.
