# 6.1 President's report: Faculty positions, Resource Allocation Model update, PBC actions on Measure G-funded programs/services, End of the Year Party on May 15, 3-5 p.m.

There were three Faculty positions, four Classified positions, and no Administrative positions submitted for consideration for the 2014-15. PBC, IPC, SSPC, APC, and ASGC members met in a special joint meeting to hear their colleagues' present justifications for each of the presentations.

Per the process, President Buckley discussed the matter of budgeted resources with the PBC. As a result, he recommends moving forward with selecting hiring committees, developing announcements, and crafting a Hiring Timeline for a Faculty position in Early Childhood Education and Classified Professional positions in Admissions and Records and Financial Aid to begin in January, 2015, at the latest. The fulltime ESL faculty replacement position has also been put forward.

In the future, the Resource Allocation Model will be used to make these important hiring decisions.

Background: The Puente Program is an academic preparation program that for more than 25 years has improved the college-going rate of tens of thousands of California's educationally disadvantaged students. Its mission is to increase the number of community college students who:

- Enroll in four-year colleges and universities
- Earn college degrees
- Return to the community as mentors and leaders of future generations

Goal: To provide Cañada College students with the opportunity to take part in this successful program. Currently, Cañada is the only college in our district that does not have a Puente Program. Given our low retention and transfer rates a program like this could be very beneficial to the students and the college as a whole.
