The QOLT Work Group was first offered in the Summer of 2017 and will be offered three times each year--once during the Fall, Spring and Summer semesters. The course is offered 100% online and the objectives of the QOLT Work Group are outlined below.

At the completion of the QOLT Work Group, participants will be able to:

- 1. Design an accessible online or hybrid course in Canvas while applying the OEI Course Design Rubric.
- 2. Assess new or existing course materials for accessibility and revise as needed.
- Construct a course that meets the needs of online or hybrid students, specifically in the area of Regular Effective Contact.
