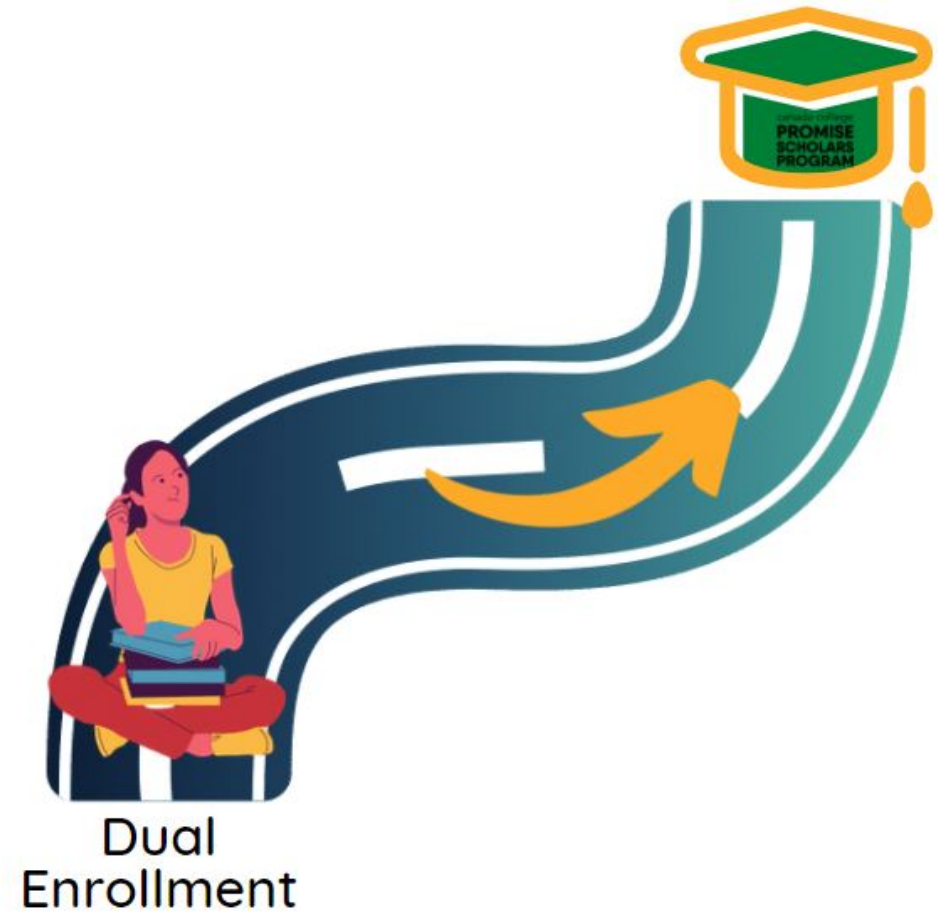

Equity Model

Part-Time Focus

- Increase accessibility
- DRC eligible students
- Students experiencing mental health challenges
- Students working to support their families (60% of our students work +20 hrs)
- Adult scholars who may not qualify for FA due to PT status

Wider Reach

- Enrollment is down – students are taking fewer credits
- Roughly CAN serves 61% of part-time students according to our 20-21 campus fact sheet data
 - Currently there are no programs that financially support PT students
 - Opportunity to maximize the number of students we serve

Commitment to Anti-racism



- Continuation of embedded anti-racist programming i.e. social justice series, identity series, destigmatizing mental health in Latinx households, Men of Color luncheon, etc.
- Collaboration with programs such as Umoja
 - Joint info sessions
 - Sharing rosters and “inreaching” to black identified students
- Data driven inquiry
 - Intrusive support to our communities of color and marginalized groups
- Professional development
 - Webinars
 - Conferences
