

College Overview

Overlooking the San Francisco Bay, Cañada College opened for instruction in September 1968. The College is located approximately 30 miles south of San Francisco and is a member of the California Community College System. Cañada College is one of three accredited colleges in the San Mateo County Community College District. The College is nestled amongst 131 acres in the western part of Redwood City and is conveniently located next to the Interstate 280 freeway.

The primary service area for Cañada College is the southern portion of San Mateo County: Redwood City, East Palo Alto, Menlo Park, San Carlos, Atherton, Portola Valley, La Honda, Woodside, Half Moon Bay, and Pescadero. Additionally, it is one of only three federally-designated Hispanic Serving Institutions in the San Francisco Bay Area.



Program Overview

Cañada College offers more than 50 degree programs leading to either an Associate of Arts (AA or ADT) or Associate of Science degree (AS or ADT). More than 40 certificates of Achievement in various specialties are offered. The College has established over 200 articulation and transfer agreements with the University of California (UC), the California State University (CSU), and private universities. **A total of 6,219 students enrolled in the College (census day) in Fall 2015.**

The College ethnic population includes 38% Hispanic, 26% White, 10% Asian, and 3% African American students.


Student Characteristics, Fall 2015

The College's student population is composed of 37% male and 61% female.


Student Age

The majority of Cañada students (77%) are parttime students, 23% of students are full-time (12+ units) students.




Degrees/Certificates Awarded and Transfer

Geographic Location


Our largest group of students reside in Redwood City (31%), followed by San Mateo (10%), East Palo Alto (9%), San Carlos (5%) Menlo Park (5%), San Francisco (6%), Belmont (3%), and Half Moon Bay (3%).

A total of 202 international students are attending Cañada College on a Student Visa (I-20).



Educational Levels

The majority of our students are high school graduates (52%), followed by students who have bachelor degrees or higher (12%). About 5% of our students have some kind of high school equivalent or certificate. About 9% of our students did not graduate from or enrolled in high school.



Educational Goal

The majority (65%) of students indicate that their educational goal is to either earn a degree, transfer, or earn a certificate. About 6% of students' educational goal is to update job skills, 4% for improving basic skills, and 9% are undecided.
